To Our Valued Customers:

Section 1502 of H.R. 4173, “The Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act” imposes upon the SEC reporting requirements upon manufacturers if their products contain materials derived from certain minerals sourced from the Democratic Republic of Congo, herein defined as “Conflict Minerals”. Conflict minerals outlined in Section 1502 of H.R. 4173 include columbite-tantalite (coltan, niobium and tantalum), cassiterite (tin), gold and wolframite (tungsten), their derivatives, and any others so designated by the U.S. Secretary of State.

Amstek Metal LLC does not melt or roll any products sold; Amstek Metal LLC processes raw material through slitting, edging, oscillating, or repackaging and distribution. Amstek Metal LLC does not know or have reason to believe that material that we supply to our customer contains any intentionally added conflict minerals or their derivatives that originate in the Democratic Republic of Congo or its adjoining countries.
